Join us at the SET Conference 2019

The second annual SET Conference is taking place at The Vox Conference Centre, Birmingham, on 6 November 2019. Shaped by members and practitioner-led, the conference will provide practical guidance for teachers, trainers and educators across the FE and Training sector.

The sold-out, award winning, inaugural event last year was a huge success. While planning the event we consulted widely across the FE sector, carrying out research and engaging experts to ensure that it met the needs of the profession. This year's event has been planned the same way and will focus on 'Promoting Professionalism' within our sector.

We have some fantastic speakers confirmed including author David Didau discussing using insights from cognitive psychology to enhance teaching practice, and Sally Dicketts, CEO of Activate Learning, addressing the subject of 'Developing Leadership Potential'.

There will also be an address from CEO of the ETF. David Russell, and a live #UKFEChat hosted by Sarah Simons. The keynote speaker sessions will be interspersed with interesting breakout sessions and panel discussions.

One of Britain's leading experts on teaching methods, Geoff Petty, is hosting two breakout sessions at the conference on Early Careers. Other breakout sessions cover topics from 'Maths and English', 'Digital Technology in Teaching' to 'SEND' and 'Mental Health and Wellbeing'.

The conference will feature an insights session on Qualified Teacher Learning and Skills (QTLS) status and Advanced Teacher Status (ATS) learner outcomes, presented by two practitioners who hold these statuses. There will also be a keynote panel on developing leadership potential, which is sure to be of interest.

Highlights of some of the ETF's services

Celebrating our ATS awardees at the inaugural Chartered Teacher graduation

We are delighted that our first successful Advanced Teacher Status (ATS) holders will graduate with their peers in the schools sector, to receive the Chartered Teacher (CTeach) designation at the Chartered College of Teaching's ceremony on Saturday 20 July in London.

It was announced at last year's SET conference that those who achieve ATS will be conferred with the Chartered College of Teaching's Chartered Teacher Status, reinforcing the award as the national standard of advanced professionalism and mastery in education.

ATS, solely conferred through SET, offers the FE sector workforce the gold standard of CPD progression and professional status. The award isn't for everyone as it is



designed for advanced practitioners, who may already be coaching within their role, have a minimum of 4 years' teaching experience, and have already achieved QTLS or QTS status.

Applications are open for the next ATS cohort due to start in October 2019. We encourage you to support your eligible colleagues to apply for this opportunity to take the next level in their professional development. Applications close in early September so there is time to prepare an application over the summer.

Developing leaders throughout your organisation

The ETF's 2019/20 Professional Workforce Development brochure outlines the organisation's government-subsidised CPD programmes, including our Chairs' Leadership Programme with Oxford Saïd Business School and the 'Leading from the Middle' Programme.

'Leading from the Middle' is specifically designed for middle managers who are increasingly vital to the success of all FE sector organisations.
